

APPRENTICESHIPS AND TRAINEESHIPS

Earn while you learn!

WHAT ARE APPRENTICESHIPS, **TRAINEESHIPS AND ASbAs?**

An **apprentice** or **trainee** is employed in industry with their employer supporting them to apply and develop the technical skills they're learning at CIT. This combination of technical skills with real-world experience is extremely valuable for someone starting out in the workforce, providing apprentices/trainees with a well-rounded personal development opportunity, and industry with a workforce trained specifically to meet their needs.

Australian School-based Apprenticeships (ASbAs) work the same way, however, spend less time at work and CIT to fit in with their school schedule. An ASbA must first get support from their school before they commit with an employer and CIT.

WHAT CAN I STUDY AT CIT AS AN APPRENTICE **OR TRAINEE?**

It's not just trades, there are so many options!

An apprenticeship generally covers traditional trades, like carpentry, automotive (including electric vehicles), plumbing, hairdressing and electrical. An apprenticeship generally takes 3-4 years to complete.

A traineeship focuses on other sectors, like health and community care, business and information technology (including cyber security). A traineeship generally take 1-2 years to complete.

An **ASbA** can be either an apprentice or a trainee. The majority of ASbAs will continue with their apprenticeship or traineeship when they finish school.

Find an employer who's willing to take you on as an apprentice, trainee or ASbA. If you're not sure where to start, contact an Apprenticeship Network Provider (ANP).

Once an employer has agreed to take you on, you and your employer should contact CIT to discuss your training needs and choose a suitable qualification.

Meet with an ANP to sign your Australian Apprenticeship Training Contract within 28 days of starting employment.



You must have an approved Australian Apprenticeship Training Contract before you can enrol at CIT. Once you have this, you can meet with CIT to develop your training plan and enrol in your qualification. Classes generally commence in February and July every year, but this will be confirmed at enrolment.



Start your training at CIT and work with your teachers and employer to develop and use your new technical skills.



Our courses make use of Aboriginal learning techniques, such as yarning circles, to enable students to foster ideas,

learn from each other and build on their existing life skills and experience in a safe and supportive learning environment.

We also offer General Education for Adults, which is designed for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people who would like to improve their reading, writing, numeracy, digital (computing) and learning skills to participate more fully in everyday life or prepare for further learning and work. At CIT Yurauna, we strive to cultivate an interactive, visual classroom that brings the outside environment inside the classroom. We are committed to providing a safe and culturally-sensitive environment that promotes inclusion and respect.

STUDENT STORY

STUDENTS FOCUS ON LEADING SUSTAINABILITY IN BUSINESS

Job opportunities in sustainability are growing as businesses place greater emphasis on reducing global greenhouse emissions and addressing the challenges of climate change.

CIT students are learning practical business skills to prioritise environmental and social sustainability as part of their business and leadership studies. Students discover how to design and build sustainable and ethical approaches into business policy and practice, putting both environmental and social issues high on the agenda.

It is becoming common practice that businesses prioritise the environment and social justice issues. "Businesses who ignore these issues do so at their peril as the protection of the natural environment, preservation of the world's resources and ethical human rights are now mainstream concerns," said one CIT Business Teacher.

One student, Erin, said the business studies course has improved her overall skills in writing, while learning more about how to plan and manage risk, business operation plans and learning to think critically about complex issues. "This course has also really helped me with developing my knowledge of business and leadership, which is really useful for most jobs."

Brendan, who comes from a landscape design background, enjoyed learning about different styles of leadership and communication and what inspires people. "One of the best parts of the course is the dynamic mix and diversity of the teaching staff. The teachers are the driving force in this course as they share their knowledge and real-life experience about what's going on in business from a sustainability perspective."

STUDENT STORY

CIT STUDENTS WIN IN-DEMAND PATHOLOGY JOBS

An increased demand for laboratory and pathology testing due to the COVID-19 pandemic saw an increase in pathology job opportunities in Canberra. Several CIT students who have studied laboratory techniques have been offered graduate positions with well-known ACT pathology companies.

Kestra Howard studied the Certificate IV in Laboratory Techniques (MSL40118) at CIT which kickstarterd her career in pathology. When Kestra was in college, a teacher told her that she would make an excellent laboratory technician. It then became her ambition to achieve that goal.

"I learned so much about how pathology works, how to identify species and run analytical testing, and why each process is so important to the safety and efficiency of the laboratory."

Laura Henry, Science and Laboratory Skills Coordinator, said the course provides experience in performing routine pathology tasks and laboratory techniques, which is experiencing strong demand with COVID-19 testing. "The focus of this certificate is to give students the skills needed to work as a technical officer in a pathology laboratory. Career opportunities include a variety of departments within pathology laboratories, biochemistry, haematology, microbiology and histology technical officers."

Laura explained that a great variety of students are attracted to this course.

"We have some students with university degrees who are looking for more hands-on practical training. We also have students retraining to change career paths or high school graduates using this as a step before a university degree."

"Entry-level positions are often advertised and have quite high turnovers, as staff are frequently moving out of entry level and into specialised roles, or further study," she said.



If you already have a USI from previous study, you will need to verify it in CIT Self Service.



COURSE FEES



FEES

As a vocational education and training (VET) provider in the ACT we charge the relevant VET fees associated with study. These student fees are complex, and may change often, so it is important that you take moment to familiarise yourself with the options you have in your chosen course of study.

Student fees are complex because they include tuition fees and some (not all) resources and other materials fees. Different courses require different periods of study, so tuition fees will differ by course. Some tuition fees are subsidised by government (Australian, state and territory) and some are not.

Some courses may have capped places available, which means only a certain number of people may make use of the applicable government subsidy. Student fees often change because these subsidies change. This means student fees may not be the same one year to another, which can make comparisons difficult. Each course listed on the CIT website will have an indicative cost, which can vary based on electives, duration and financial assistan<u>ce</u>.
