FOUNDATION SKILLS

Prepare for further study, improve your employment opportunities and refresh your existing skills with CIT's range of Statement of Attainments in skills for work and vocational pathways.

A Foundation Skills course will provide you with the support to develop the skills you need to succeed in vocational learning. The courses focus on developing your writing, reading, learning, math's and digital skills through small group-based learning, preparing you to meet the entry requirements for further study. We deliver Statements of Attainment designed to support your literacy, numeracy, and communication development to meet the course requirements for further studies at CIT or to increase your skills for the workplace.

Statement of Attainment - Literacy for the Workplace

This course is tailored for individuals looking to boost their workplace literacy, especially in reading and writing. The course is designed to support those with varying levels of reading proficiency. It features units that strengthen your ability to understand and engage with workplace texts, whether they're digital or printed. Learn essential reading strategies to find and analyse important information effectively. Along with developing practical writing skills for creating workplace documents in both formal and informal styles, suitable for digital and printed formats, including understanding your audience and purpose of the writing and use of grammar, sequencing and presentation.

This course will prepare you in the foundation skills of reading and writing which are essential to all jobs.

Statement of Attainment - Numeracy for the Workplace

The course is designed for individuals seeking to boost their numeracy skills for study or work. The course focuses on numeracy and estimation strategies covering basic math operations, problem-solving processes and how to develop and apply estimate techniques for accurate measurement and calculation of workplace tasks. By the end of the course, you will have the confidence and skills necessary to perform required numeracy calculations in the workplace.

This course will prepare you with the foundation skills of numeracy and problem-solving which is essential for all jobs.

Practical Skills for Work and Learning - Non-Accredited Training

This course is designed as a support course for individuals currently enrolled in CIT courses and those preparing to study at CIT needing help developing their skills and confidence with using digital technologies for learning, reading and writing, maths, communication and strategies for learning. This course focuses on building practical skills and improving confidence through practice and guided support in small group-based learning environments.

Individuals who complete these subjects will be holistically prepared for employment or further study at a level where they can work with direction in a range of contexts both familiar and unfamiliar.

ACT SENIOR SECONDARY CERTIFICATE

(post-school option)

The ACT Senior Secondary Certificate provides you with an opportunity to advance your academic skills for further study and work. The certificate offers both an accredited package for students as well as a tertiary package for those needing an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) for direct entry into university. You can complete the certificate or choose to do individual courses to improve your academic skills and knowledge.

CIT offers a range of subjects during the day and in the evenings including English, mathematics, biology, physics, history, global studies, and chemistry. To work out your course of study, please book in with one of our staff to complete a skills evaluation and talk through an appropriate course of study based on your individual circumstances.

Completing the ACT Senior Secondary Certificate will also allow for further education through CIT and University, TAFE Diplomas and Advanced Diplomas and specific employment areas requiring an ACT Senior Secondary Certificate for general employment.
