## MOU with the University of Canberra

On 27 August CIT and the University of Canberra (UC) signed an MOU to strengthen educational opportunities between the two organisations. This marks the beginning of an exciting partnership between CIT and UC which will benefit students and the ACT community now and into the future.

## **Recent Activities**

The Board is looking forward to finalisation of the new CIT strategic plan which is in the final stages of development. The Board thanks all staff and stakeholders for their time and contribution to the development of the plan. The plan sets out a 10-year vision for the CIT which is inspired by renewed focus on the relevance and status of vocational education and training in Australia. CIT is an engine
