## Statement of Attainment training in Supporting Mental Health [extract from CHC32015]

### Overview

This course is designed to help you get the skills you need to establish relationships with people who are living with mental health issues, clarify their needs and work collaboratively with them. It is designed for support workers in contexts outside the mental health sector, but who come into contact with people with mental health issues. The services and support provided are not mental health specific.

- Establish respectful relationships with people with mental health issues.
- Work out the needs of people with mental health issues.
- Work with them so they can meet their aspirations and needs.

This short online course will take approximately six (6) weeks. You will be required to participate approximately ten (10) hours per week to complete the course.

Delivery is online, with final assessments completed in two face to face practical workshops where you can practice the skills learned online.

These skills are for any general workplace where you will come in contact with people with mental health issues - it is not designed for people in the mental health sector.

You will be required to complete some additional hours of independent study, including online activities and assessment.
